Logan Central Summit Outcomes

At the conclusion of the Logan Central Summit and community engagement period, a total of 679 submissions were received with 902 ideas on a future Logan Central.

A <u>summary</u> of all the summit ideas resulted in the identification of 27 key actions, comprising of 49 initiatives that align with the four urban design themes.

What's next for Logan Central?

On 26 February 2019, Council approved the <u>Logan Central Implementation Plan</u> to guide planning and delivery of priority projects and programs in Logan Central, which build upon the overall objectives of the Logan Central Master Plan and incorporate the outcomes of the Logan Central Summit.
